

# Autumn planning – pasture and fodder options

*Decisions around the autumn break can have lasting impacts through the following winter and spring. Producers now face critical decisions around managing existing pastures and fodder options to increase production.*

*Agriculture Victoria is inviting producers to a free workshop. This event includes commercial agronomists who will advise producers on selecting suitable species, and management for winter grazing and spring fodder conservation.*

*There will also be a session on livestock nutritional requirements and feed budgeting, presented by Agriculture Victoria.*

Producers will have the opportunity to talk with company representatives and discuss fodder options that are directly applicable to their own farms.

Producers will be given clear information around:

- what options are available for either grazing or fodder conservation
- how and when to establish
- when to graze.
